If you watch birds solely for your own enjoyment, a written description of your observations is unnecessary. Compilers of regional bird lists must insist that their records be scientifically sound; future bird students--those studying occurrences 50 years from now--must have a written record on which to depend. By providing the verifying written description, you are employing a basic rule of the scientific method.

Thus this request is an effort to perpetuate your record by obtaining concrete evidence which may be permanently preserved for examination by others in the future. Distance from bird, and how measured: 100 YDS. — 35 YD. ESTIMATE

Describe the bird's overall behavior: MARK CROMLEY & I OBSERVED THE BIRD IN FLIGHT OVER HEAD & THEN IT LANDED SHARPLY LEWKWARD, FOLDED ITS WINGS & PLUMMETTED DOWNWARD WITH A SHOUT "TAWIT" AND LANDED AMONG A FLOCK OF 60 MIGRATED GODWITS THAT WERE FEEDING IN SHALLOW WATER; A FLOCK THAT HAD A PARTIAL ALBINO GODWIT THAT DENNIS SHIRLEY WAS OBSERVING WHEN THIS BIRD MARK & I WERE OBSERVING LANDED RIGHT BY IT, WHEN IT BEGAN FEEDING WITH THE OTHER GODWITS BY FOLDING & WITH ITS LONG BILL IN THE SHALLOW WATER.

WE OBSERVED THE WHITE WING STRIPE & THE BROAD WHITE TAIL BAND AT THIS TIME WHEN IT WAS LANDING.

Describe the habitat in which you observed the bird:

SHORELINE OF PELICAN LAKE. MUDFLAT HABITAT. NO TREES, SCATTERED LOW-LYING VEGETATION (WEEDS & BRUSH).

SIZE - WILLET-SIZED: SMALLER THAN MARBLED GODWITS WITH WHICH IT WAS FEEDING SIMILAR TO WILLETS, 4 OF WHICH WERE FEEDING IN THE GROUP.

SHAPE - SLENDER - NOT PLUMP LONGER THAN GREATER YELLOW LEGS

PLUMAGE & COLOR PATTERN - TOP OF HEAD GRAYISH OR DARK

BREAST & ABDOMEN - SIDE OF HEAD LIGHT GRAY WITH DISTINCT WHITE EYE LINE
BACK - DAKIC BROWN - DARKER THAN THE MARBLED GODWIT.

LEGS - BRUNISH-BLACK

WINGS - DARK WING WITH BROAD WHITE WING STRIPE & BLACK WING LINING.

TAIL - BLACK w/ 1-2" X TAIL WITH BROAD WHITE BAND CLOSEST TO END.

UNDERTAIL COverts WERE HARRONKY BANDED BLACK & WHITE (JUST LIKE PICTURE IN AUDUBON EASTERN FIELD GUIDE, BUT WHICH IS NOT INDICATED IN ANY OF THE WESTERN FIELDGUIDES).

BILL - LONG, BUT NOT AS LONG AS MARBLED & SLIGHTLY UP TURNED; BASAL $\frac{2}{3}$ WAS ORANGISH & TIP ($\frac{1}{3}$) WAS BLACK.

Describe the bird's calls or sounds, if heard; including method of delivery--
i.e., from perch, in flight, etc.:

SINGLE CALL IN FLIGHT AS IT WAS LANDING WITH OTHER GODWITS.

List similar species and how you eliminated them:

MARBLED GODWITS - THESE WERE LARGER & LIGHTER-COLORED; LONGER AND DEFINITE UP TURNED BILL.

**BAR-TAILED GODWITS - LIGHTER BREAST; UNIFORMLY COLORED HEAD & CHEEK,
FINER & MORE NUMBERED TAIL BARRING.**

Prior experience with this and similar species: **NONE WITH THIS ONE,**
BUT I.D. IS CERTAIN.
ALL OF US HAVE SEEN THE MARBLED GODWIT A NUMBER OF TIMES.
