of the front bill

The bird often extended its wings and the white flashy wing stripe was observed to extend onto the primaries.

Female #1

Bill and head shape similiar to male

Body and head all brown except for extensive white around bill and a white cresent which was very distinct on the ear coverts.

Female #2

Similiar to female #1 except mark on ear coverts was more like an oval.

All three birds were smaller than near by Lesser Scaup

Voice or call notes and method of delivery:

Not heard

Behavior: Spent a great deal of the time with heads down, occasionally

would dive.

Habitat: In a fairly deep portion of a lake.

What similar species might it have been and how were these eliminated:

Lesser Scaup have a much more peaked head, smaller, different shaped hail, bill is smaller and less scoter like, These are diagnostic marks.

Other marks which are not diagnostic but are more often associated with greater scaups than lesser scaups that were seen on these birds:

Wing stripe went out flashy white onto the primaries. The white creasent,/oval behind the eye. Greater amount of white aroung the bill Whiter sides
