The median crown stripe was quite distinct, and a semed grayish to me. The bird was perched on a fence wire, and changed positions, giving me excellent fore and aft views. The rump was brown, showing absolutely no trace of gray. Overall plumage was somewhat buffy; the facial pattern, while noticeable, and definite, was not what I would call stribing - shere were definite markings but they were not bold or bright, Breast was barically uniform in color.

The stripe was definitely lighter charthe rest of the crown - with, estimate, maybe 16 of head drameter, (The latter is an after-the-fact observation)
