a small earthen dam reservoir, approx. 20-40 acres in size. In open waters.

What similar species might it have been and how were these eliminated:

american wigeon - when compared directly with the nearby american widgeon, the american widgeon had gray on the side of the head (with green) and a white crown that narrowed at the base of the bill and gray-brown back and sides

redhead- has black chest and no white crown.

What experience have you had with this and similar species:

We have no experience with the eurasian widgeon but have seen american widgeon and redhead many times.

Books, illustrations, and advice consulted, and how did these influence this description:

Ella Soresen told us of having seen the bird at the same location on the day before. We use the Nat. Geographic field guide as a reference.

Significance of record in this area or the state:

Considered causual in Utah with several observations, a photograph and speciement. It has been seen at this time of year in Northern Utah.
