Jescription of bird. Size, Colors, all field marks OBSERVED - Unique features of this bird, if any. The bird was relocated in Dame general area after first siting by Robert atwood. Bird was first sited than binoculars at 100 yls for 15 sec. while perched on telephone pole. The bird fluw past us at ~ 50 yds and then circled slowly up, giving us a long look while soaring with northern Warriers. This bird did not exhibit typical Buteo. like flight. Wing motion was stiff and "wristy" as in falcons. Wings were broad but pointed however not "trufe pointed" as in Peregrine. This of bird was in view long enough for us to locate and fellow bird in Questar. Please refer to atwood's write up for additional plumage description.
