Initial reaction was gull. Same sine, general bond body shape and color (though noticeably darker) as California Gull nearby. Also had white throat, breast and head as gull,—except for tern-like black cap. The line between black (above) and white (below) started at base of black bill and angled upward to bottom of eye and continued at same angle to peak below the crown on the side of the head and then downward to a sharp point on the back of the head. Bill was gull-like and black. Feet and legs were black or very dark grey. Flight was more tern-like than gull-like. I was confused by tern-like flight and black cap versus gull-like bill, coloration and body shape. I hoped to see whether tail was forked (tern-like) or fanned (gull-like). When bird banked to land, loogds away, tail was fanned but with 2 star central streamers that were again as long as the rest of the tail feathers. At this point I realized that bird was a Jaegar. I looked for dusky band across throat, of which there was no hint. Looked for yellow on throat, but found none after close inspection. Concluded it was Long-tailed Jaegar based on lack of dusky throat band and length of streamers.
