LARGE SHOREBIRD WITH A LONG SLIGHTLY UPTURNED GYDING BULL WITH A BLACK TIP, THE BIRD WAS IN A MIXED FLOCK OF B.B. PLOVERS, RED KNOTS, RUDDY TURNSTONES (1), AND MOTABLY, MARBLED GODWITS & L.B. DOWITCHERS. THIS BIRD WAS NOTICEABLY (2 HEADS) SMALLER THAN THE MARBLED GODWITS AND ABOUT 3X LARGER THAN THE DOWITCHERS. THE UNDERPARTS WERE A DARK RICH CHESTNUT AND THE UPPER PORTS WERE DARK BROWNSH BLACK WITH LICHTER TIPS TO SOME OF THE FEATHERS (SCAPULARS & WING COVERTS. THE HEAD (FACE, THROAT, & CROWN) WAS NOTICEABLY LICHTER THAN THE UPPER BODY OF LOWER PARTS. NO EYETINE WAS ObseRVED. WHEN THE BIRD PREEDED, THE RUMP WAS SEEN AS WHITE, THE TAIL WAS BOCK. WHEN THE BIRD FLUSHED, BOTH UPPER & LOWER WING SURFACES WERE block with white bases to the first feathers giving the appearance of A white wing bure.

FEEDING IN SAME PROBING STYLE AS MARBIED GUDWITS

MUD FIAT WHERE FRESH WATER ENTERED THE G.S.L. VIRTUALLY NO VEGETATION BUT SOME SPARSE EMERCANT ALALAI BULLRUSHE & PICKLEWEED WERE PRISENT.

What similar species might it have been and how were these eliminated: MAINERED GODINT - DIFFERENT COLOR- NO WIND STrIPE - LARGER & PRIER WILLET. DIFFERENT COLOR- SHORTER THICKER BILL. MUCH BOLDER WINC STRIPE Downthers - much smaller proportionstely longer bull Backtailed Godait - underparts less colorfol, wino linuos where not BLACK
